TYSA/TFC Developmental Teams offer additional training and playing time for Under 8 & 10 recreational soccer players.

- Technical Training—advanced individual skills training

The Developmental Team will provide additional training to Under 8 & 10 TYSA players who desire to train and play at a higher level. **THIS IS NOT A SOCCER CAMP OR A COMMITMENT TO PLAY SELECT SOCCER!!!**

This will be additional training held at a time which **WILL NOT** conflict with the player’s Parks and Rec Team.

In the event of a schedule conflict with a player’s Parks and Rec team, the player **MUST** attend the Parks and Rec team activity.

The Developmental Teams will begin practicing in September. Practices will cease at the completion of the regular Parks and Rec season in April.

Participation in tournaments is left to the discretion of the individual teams and coaches.



WHAT IS SELECT SOCCER?

Competitive Travel Teams

Most youth sports organizations form tournament teams to give individual players exposure to play at a higher level. In our sport, the higher levels of play are often called ‘Select’, Division I, or “Club” soccer. (Park and Rec play is Division III soccer.)

Tupelo Youth Soccer Association (TYSA) formed the Tupelo Futbol Club (TFC) to operate the Division I (Select) Program. Select teams are chosen from pools of players who try out around June of each year.

The Developmental Teams were formed to give younger players the opportunity to further develop their skills in preparation for Select try-outs.

Select soccer is a major commitment on the part of players and their families. But the payoff can be especially rewarding in participation at a more advanced level and in exposure to college coaches.
